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I have been the Clinical Lead for Medical Photography at Lancashire Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust since October 2021. In this role, I manage a small team of clinical photographers and administrative staff, delivering photography and 3D imaging services across the Trust. As a Major Trauma Centre, the work is both diverse and challenging and encompasses a wide range of specialties and patient needs.

I began my career at Royal Bolton Hospital in 1995 as a Trainee Clinical Photographer and progressed to the role of Senior Clinical Photographer.
